## Hurricane Katrina Debris Mission

Hurricane Katrina has been ranked as the costliest natural disaster in United States history. Katrina caused catastrophic damage and destruction to infrastructure, resources, and commodities. Cycle was able to begin recovery efforts just one day after Katrina made landfall. Cycle Construction Company performed as a major subcontractor to Ashbritt and later to Ceres for the United States Army Corps of Engineers cleanup project. Cycle's designated area was the City of Covington. Cycle's effort included management of all field crews and subcontractors as well as coordination with public officials and residents to return the area to pre-storm conditions.

This contract included:

- Removal of approximately 500,000 cy of storm generated debris from city right-of-ways and ditches
- Management of temporary removal and disposal site
- Recycled, hauled, and disposed of over 200,000 cy of mulch from waste stream
- Demolished and disposed of numerous hazardous structures
- Performed Right-of-Entry services for approximately 500 residences
- Removed and hauled hazardous trees, tree limbs, and stumps
